

## TOWN

### 1. A GREEN LIVING ENVIRONMENT.

- Controlling building extensions, expansion of green spaces.
- Flood prevention by natural flow of rainwater.
- Historical heritage and patrimony preserved with associations.

### 2. PUBLIC AMENITIES - PRIORITY OF THIS LEGISLATURE: FOOT AND CYCLE TRAFFIC NETWORKS.

#### Improving or completing:

- Cycle network, cycle boxes and racks near transport hubs and residential areas.
- Neighbourhood pedestrian network, adapted to persons with reduced mobility (PRM).
- Security near schools and traffic junctions.
- Reduction of construction site noise nuisance to the strict minimum.
- Street modernisation, pavements and street furniture.
- Deterrence of through traffic: 30 km/h and local traffic zones.
- Sheltered public benches, especially near bus stops.
- Flood prevention investment.
- LED street lighting for security and economic efficiency.

### 3. ENVIRONMENT - CLEANLINESS - APPLYING THE EUROPEAN COVENANT OF MAYORS CLIMATE PLAN.

- Financial incentives and techniques for saving energy and water.
- Free communal land for citizens initiatives (collective gardens).
- Improving and completing the green (nature) and blue (watercourse) networks.
- Waste separation recycling in public areas.
- Optimising recycling.
- Combatting fly-tipping.
- Improving awareness of waste minimisation management.
- Dog waste stations with excrement bags.

### 4. REMEDIES AGAINST AND SUPPRESSION OF NOISE POLLUTION.

- Ring and flyover: support for intercommunal forums and associations involved and recourse to legal remedies.
- Requiring the prohibition of night overflights from 23.00 to 7.00.
- Requiring the placement of noise barriers promised by the Flemish Region along both sides of the Ring and compliance with the 90 km/h speed limit on the Ring.

### 5. HELP FOR FAMILIES / SOCIAL ACTION.

- Objective and verifiable financial assistance for early childhood care.
- Partnerships for the adaptation of living spaces and support for people with disabilities.
- Intergenerational and multi-family homes. (redevelopment of dwellings).
- Psychosocial assistance to families accompanying a dependent person.
- Creation of a "Repair Café" against equipment obsolescence.
- Volunteer public writer action.
- Promoting integration through multicultural events.

### 6. FOR OUR SENIOR CITIZENS, PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES AND THE SOCIALLY ISOLATED.

- Promoting the autonomy of seniors and fighting against loneliness.
- Continuing to offer services and home help (meals, care, transport).
- Continuing training in computing and communication technologies.
- Promoting housing and living spaces adapted to seniors.
- Establishing partnerships between the initiatives of the CPAS, of Primary Care - Eerste Lijn Zorg (ELZ) and the private initiatives of health professionals.

### 7. PARTICIPATING IN CITIZENS INITIATIVES.

- Defining the citizen participation code. Optimising the digital platform, inviting residents to express themselves with participate and coordination in certain projects.
- Proactive, user-friendly and accessible communication.
- Establishing participation in citizen budgets.

### 8. TEACHING AND LEARNING SUPPORT

- To both Flemish and French-speaking education networks.
- Promoting language learning and language exchanges.
- Promoting a healthy and balanced food diet at school.

### 9. RECEPTION AND ADMINISTRATIVE AND REGULATORY SUPPORT FOR INHABITANTS, RESIDENTS AND NEW ARRIVALS.

- Digital media point for simple administrative procedures (identity card, passport ...) and personalised reception by appointment (specific requests).
- Digital media assistance to residents during administrative procedures (urban planning, premiums, civil status ...).
- Support in their relations with federal and regional administrations (pensions, unemployment, taxation, etc.).
- Multilingual reception for all inhabitants.

### 10. STRENGTHENING PEOPLE PROTECTION, PROPERTY AND PRIVACY.

- Speed limit enforcement, controlling dangerous driving, driving under the influence, local traffic rule violation and unauthorised parking.
- Presence of neighbourhood officers and prevention of theft and incivility. Promoting participation in local prevention while respecting individual relationships between people (Local Prevention Partnership).
- Encouraging the use of neighbourhood mediation.
- Continuing steps for a local branch of Justice of the Peace.

### 11. SPORT - YOUTH HELP.

- Suitable premises for youth movements.
- Action plan and establishing a youth centre accessible for all.
- Increasing support for socio-cultural and sports associations.
- Expanding existing "sports and culture" cheques to include 6-year olds.
- Developing a fitness trail in Ban Eik.
- Further developing playgrounds including access for persons with reduced mobility.
- Improving the existing sports infrastructure in accordance with the wishes of local residents (hockey, running).

### 12. CULTURE-LEISURE: ENCOURAGING CITIZENS MEETINGS.

- Promoting arts and crafts at local level, organising temporary exhibitions of communal and private initiatives.
- At the new Library, organising an branch with a toy library at Ban Eik and promoting early reading literacy.

### 13. SOCIO-ECONOMIC AND COMMUNAL FINANCE AREA: «ZERO DEBT» OBJECTIVE IN 2023.

- Taxation based on what is necessary for corresponding services.
- Means for new initiatives of general interest.
- Promoting the development of local shops and services.
- Support for self-employed persons who are unable to work or who have temporary difficulties, as well as help for those who wish to start an activity in the commune.
- Support for the Association of Traders and the Self-Employed.

### 14. INTER-COMMUNITY COOPERATION.

Strengthening the efficiency of collaboration with neighbouring municipalities, particularly with Kraainem (police, waste collection, mobility, culture, social assistance).

- Maintaining collaboration with neighbouring Brussels municipalities such as Sint-Pieters-Woluwe and Sint-Lambrechts-Woluwe and synergies with other municipalities with language facilities.

### 15. COMMUNITY, LINGUISTIC.

- Defending the full maintenance of linguistic facilities.
- Ensuring the proper application of the agreement on the judicial rights of Francophones.
- Supporting the initiatives of the UF (Union of Francophones).
- Requiring the ratification of the Framework Convention for the Protection of National Minorities.

## PCSA

The aim of the Public Centre for Social Action (PCSA) is to ensure that all people lead a life in accordance with human dignity, social, financial or health. Among the challenges of the coming years of our social environment, the ageing of the population, the prevention of risks, the autonomy of all, young people and elders, are therefore the essential objectives of our team.

- Support the provision of diversified assistance services (seniors, patients) at home.
- Prioritize quality of life, promote integration into the social life of the most vulnerable and make them more self-sufficient.
- Create a free mail writing officer.
- Promote integration through multicultural events.
- Improve the supply of transportation for people who are moving with difficulty.
- Support for people with disabilities will be based on partnerships to adapt their living space.
- Psychological and social Assistance for families accompanying and assisting a dependent person.
- Protect children in the context of families experiencing difficulties.
- Early childhood care will be based on financial assistance depending of objective and verifiable parameters.
- Promote and support intergenerational initiatives with the municipality (reallocation of existing buildings as multifamily housing).
- Promote the provision of housing to accessible rents.
- To promote local services, in particularly at the "Ban-Eik" such as the implementation of group purchases and a social-priced food trade project.
- Creation of a «Repair Café» (small repairs of everyday objects) against the obsolescence of the equipment and for the savings.
- Ensure that unemployment and retirement do not lead to social exclusion.
- Strengthen prevention, reception, support and mediation for people facing debt.
- Develop partnerships with PCSA of other municipalities with the same status.
- Regularly inform on the social action in the municipality via a bilingual brochure and website.
